Instructional Techniques for Teleconferencing

This program introduces how to deliver workplace learning and instruction by phone or conference call. You will explore new techniques and skills for this delivery methodology.

Delivered in the form of a teleclass, the program models the methods presented in the program. Equivalent to a one-day program, the course includes two 2-hour teleclass sessions dedicated to the discussion of the content and one 2-hour session dedicated to practice presentations and feedback.

During the program each participant will deliver a 10-minute practice lesson and will receive feedback from the facilitator and fellow learners. Participants will also do some preparation for the practice lesson outside of the teleclass.
